




CLAIR'S ASSESSING AWARD

Clair has completed her Level 3 Award in Assessing Competence in the Work Environment through ELN. This means that she can now assess City and Guilds and Open Awards Level 1 in horse care.

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The students are always on the lookout for ways to enrich our animals and improve their living areas. Here, one of our students has come up with a clever design for a shelter to protect the chickens dust baths from getting wet in the rain!

There have been a lot of Forest School sessions. These sessions have included learning different flora and fauna, tree climbing, following trails through the woods, learning how to start fires, starting fires independently and cooking on fires. Students have been able to work on their independent skills as well as had the opportunities to take supported risks within the woodland environment.








Students have been getting creative in green wood-working! Here are a few examples of items students have made recently - an incredible personalised lightsaber, a boat and a battle ship!



One of our students really challenged himself to make a toy box for his dogs to take home. Using the many skills he had learnt in green wood-working over the years, he managed to create this amazing toy box which he then painted and decorated for his dogs!

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The students had 2 opportunities to visit Tollerton Airfield. They had a tour of the hanger and got to see lots of different planes and helicopters. They then had a talk from the owner of the Provost Jet and had the chance to ask lots of questions. She talked about aviation and navigation as well as facts about the jet. The students were allowed to sit in the jet and were shown all the controls. The students were then lucky enough to be given a demo of the jet! They all had a great time and enjoyed this unique experience.



Our horse care students had the opportunity to visit Quorn Kennels. They had a super morning learning what it takes to be a groom for the hunt and what an average day looks like for a groom. They also attempted to muck out in industry standard time (10 minutes) and they all did extremely well! The students then spent time meeting the horses and learnt what to look for in a good hunt horse. They had the opportunity to look in their tack room and looked at all the different bits and learning their names and purposes.

The students then had a tour of the kennels where they got to meet all of the hounds and learn all about their history and their role within the hunt. The students then got to go in with the hound puppies which they all absolutely loved!

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NLT has a wide variety of qualifications to offer our students. Over the last term our staff have been busy matching students to the most relevant qualifications on offer at NLT, in order for them to make the most out of their time here. We have students working towards level 1 horse care, level 1 animal care, entry level and level 1 Maths and English and for the first time in a few years, level 2 horse care. Students have worked hard towards their qualifications this half term engaging in practical and theoretical sessions to help them learn the skills and knowledge required for their courses. Some are also beginning to complete practical and theoretical assessments towards the qualifications to make sure they make steady progress through the units throughout the year. None of this would be possible without the team of knowledgeable staff and animals helping them through their course.





We have also had a big uptake on the British Horse Society (BHS) Changing Lives Through Horses programme this year with a record 9 students registered. This is a horse care course aimed at young people interested in learning to ride and care for horses. Through learning to care for and ride the horses, they also develop other life skills including confidence, communication, team work, developing relationships, perseverance and developing responsibility.











BHS christmas Cracker Dressage Competition

In November several of NLT's horse care students took part in an online dressage competition against other riding schools. This gave the students the experience of preparing a horse for a show or competition and competing against others. NLT's team came 6th with several of the riders also being placed individually, including one young rider who won the under 10's class! The students (and staff) loved getting the horses cleaned up to show standard and everyone was very proud of their achievements.



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We had a visit from the BHS who brought along their weigh bridge to perform health checks on all of our horses. The horse care students took an active role in the health checking, looking at the horse's body condition scores as well as leading the horses on and off the weigh bridge.

All the horses were in great condition - Finley even won a rosette for being in perfect condition!



NLT Animals Get In The Halloween Spirit

Some of our students didn't want the animals to miss out on some Halloween fun, so they got creative with some felt and card to make some mini witches hats!















Marengo, NLT's foal has spent the summer months living with the retired horses. They have taken him under their wing and taught him how to behave appropriately with other horses. He has also practiced wearing fly masks and having his feet handled and trimmed by the farrier, and now, he comes and lines up with the other horses ready to have his pedicure. He has grown quite a bit this year and is now the same size as his mum, Velvet!







Jasmine's First Full Term at New Legf

Jasmine joined the NLT team in February 2023. She has had a wonderful summer learning about life at New Leaf Triangle and making herself a big part of the team. She has proved a loving and trustworthy mount for a variety of children coming to NLT, from children who have never ridden before, to novice riders learning to have their first canter. She also benefits from being ridden by some of the more experienced riders on horse care courses, who are able to teach her new things. Jasmine is not phased by anything and has loved hacking out on the roads around NLT with her best friends, Beauty and Finley. She is just as happy to stand while children play "hook a duck" or "ball in bucket" from her back whilst having their first ever ride. Jasmine is now looking forwards to a few weeks off with her friends over Christmas before coming back in January to continue her own education and continue helping our students overcome their own struggles and learn how to ride and care for horses.









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As part of the 'Grow a Tree in 23' campaign, at New Leaf we reflected this in one of our weekly themes. Staff and students were encouraged to get involved in planting trees by learning about tree identification through looking at bark and leaves in Forest School.

During one of the sessions, a group of students went into the woods and found a variety of seeds. They planted holly, walnut and hazel trees from what they collected in the woods.

Coles Plant Centre very kindly donated 30 trees for the scheme which will be planted down the archery track at site 2, provide more coverage for the site 2 drive and join the younger seedlings that were planted by the Young Farmers at our site in Old Dalby.







New Legf Allotment













The students have worked really hard since the summer on our new allotment.

They have all been a part of its development, whether that is planting the fruit, vegetables or herbs, taking their turn to water the allotment, checking on them, picking the fruit and vegetables when they're ripe and then either feeding them to the animals or using them to make a snack or meal for everyone. The students grew beetroot, potatoes, tomatoes, sunflowers, chillies, strawberries, raspberries and cucumbers.

It has been an excellent project that has enabled a lot of the students to learn about where their food comes from as well as helping them to achieve certificates towards their Challenge Awards or Vocational Awards.

Retired Horses Update

Students have had the opportunity to visit our retired horses and ponies over at our site in Old Dalby. They have been able to witness what it is like for a herd to live out naturally and observe how they interact with each other. Some of our retired horses need extra care and attention and so our horse care students have been able to participate in their daily checks as well as helping to care for them, such as changing poultices and field maintenance.

In the pictures, you can see Tyler, Harley, Dazzle, George, Wendy and of course, Marengo who has been living out with the older horses. They have all done an excellent job

raising him!

All of our retired horses are doing really well. Star and Pickle have found a new lease of life living out on their track system. Tyler, now aged 28, is doing exceptionally well with his one eye. He and his best friend Harley

joined the rest of the herd at Dalby in recent months. Wendy, our ex-cavalry horse, is now an amazing age of 31! She is still thriving and is finding ways to adapt to age related complications.

New Leaf horses Sox, Jazz, Jack, Jasmine, Velvet, Mary and Beauty all spend their Christmas holiday at Dalby - a chance for everyone to relax and recharge ahead of the new year!
















Holiday Sessions Coming Soon!

We will have limited spaces for respite during February half term which are weather dependant and not for riding horses as they are away for the winter.

RESPITE SESSIONS

Respite Sessions can be booked for a minimum of three hours (or sometimes we can do two hours on request) and allow your child to attend without parents being present. Your child will have dedicated one to one support at all times (or two to one support on request) and will engage in a range of activities according to their interests. FAMILY SESSIONS

Family Sessions can be booked for 1 or 2 hours. You will have a dedicated member of staff to take you round different activities. Activities include riding and mounted games, time with the animals, forest school, arts, crafts, games. It's relaxed and fun so discuss with your staff what you'd like to do. Parents can join in with the children as much or as little as they like and there is no restriction on the size of the family the only thing to bear in mind is that each staff member can only work with one horse or one activity at a time. Bigger families can look to book two members of staff instead of one. There's no minimum age to take part, and babies can be brought along as long as they are supervised at all times. There is some play equipment (basket swing, trampoline, sandpit etc) that children can use if they are waiting between activities, but these must be supervised by parents.

Don't forget our site is muddy in the winter and it can be pretty chilly, meaning some of the activities will be limited. Please enquire about what's available before you book to avoid any disappointment on the day!
