### A MESSAGE FROM LORRAINE AND TROY



Hello everyone,

We have been enjoying the better weather at New Leaf recently after a long wet winter! It has been great to see that the staff and students have still got stuck in, despite the rain, and have been having fun and learning lots along the way.

We can't believe it's our 10 year anniversary this year. We started back on 9th September 2014 where we just had a couple of families with children with autism who came every other weekend for a couple of hours. It was just us two doing everything in those days and Troy worked with families and built all the cabins, animal housing, fencing and set up all the equipment around a demanding full time job!

In 2015 we had our first education student and the business grew steadily over the next two years and then started to snowball and we now have 55 students, a permanent waiting list, 18 staff and 39 animals. The first horses were Star, Tyler and Finley and Holly was the only dog! We had the two goats, Rex and Woody, one rabbit, Angel, and 2 rats, Tom and Jerry! It's been an incredible journey with lots of fun, especially in the first few years of family camps in the tipi tents, where we spent many a night singing around the campfire with families. We have seen a lot of students make some amazing, and, in some cases, life changing progress, and move on to the next chapter of their lives. We have had some great staff over the years, and we still have Laura, Emily and Jeanette (voluntary Director) who have been with us for much of that time and been part of the journey!

We have had some great furry and feathered team members over the years all of whom have contributed to the success of New Leaf over the last 10 years!

## >>> NEW LEAF STUDENTS TOOK PART IN THE BRITISH HORSE SOCIETY'S (BHS) NATIONAL RIDING SCHOOL CHAMPIONSHIPS!

The students at New Leaf had the opportunity to take part in in-house qualifiers for the BHS' National Riding School Championships. All the students worked extremely hard for weeks practicing and learning their dressage tests in preparation for their qualifiers. Ben very kindly judged each students test and 6 of our students qualified to compete at Pickering Grange, Ellistown, in the Championships!

Beauty, Mary and Jasmine were the 3 New Leaf horses selected for the competition. This was a new and exciting opportunity for them all as they don't often go out to competitions. Emily, Kelly and Tilly put in an enormous amount of effort behind the scenes preparing the mares for their big moment. They took them to various local shows to get them used to the atmosphere and to help reduce their separation anxiety.







It was a big busy event with lots of eager competitors. Our students all did extremely well, all coming home with rosettes and being great ambassadors for New Leaf throughout the day, working as a team and supporting each other. The horses did us proud; it was a big deal for them as they stayed the night before at Pickering Grange and they aren't used to being away from home or in a busy competition environment.

#### >>> TRAINING DAYS

Staff have had a lot of training this year so far! Training has included first aid, health and safety, animal care, horse handling and safety, education, safeguarding, green woodworking, Attachment, Equine Facilitated Learning (EFL) and some staff have started an Avered in Education and Training with Carly

#### >>> FOREST SCHOOL

Some of our staff have now achieved their Level 2 Forest School qualification through Open Awards. Kelly, Laura and Lauren completed several training days learning how to tie a variety of knots, build different types of shelters, the names and uses of different Forest School tools and learned how to start and maintain fires. They also completed portfolios based on the theory behind Forest School and the benefits Forest School can have for our students. They then planned and led several Forest School sessions which they were assessed on how they put all the theory and training into practice.







A number of our staff have also recently completed their Level 1 Forest School Qualification. Charlotte, Freya and Jack have been learning different Forest School knots, the principles of Forest School as well as different ways to incorporate Forest School into their sessions with students at New Leaf.

#### >>> SAD NEWS ABOUT STAR





Sadly we lost our very special 'Star' on Saturday 13th April aged 29. Star, aka Nightly or Noodles, was the most amazing pony, belonging to Lorraine and Troy's daughter, Tilly, for the last 12 years and working for New Leaf as the first pony in 2014 until she retired a couple of years ago. She was a super 'Star' in all the family camps and fun days, always a favourite, with her gentle loving nature. She loved to hack out, do the games (very enthusiastically!), take children on adventures as knights in combat or magical fairy princesses, being totally fearless and accepting of any props we used. In 2020 she represented the UK in the World Horseback Archery Championships with Tilly, storming down the archery range at a great pace! She gave such a lot and will leave a very big hole in all our hearts.



## **ANIMAL UPDATES**

#### >>> VELVET UPDATE

Velvet has recently had back x-rays due to ongoing issues with bringing her back into work after having her foal, Marengo, 2 years ago. This was interesting learning for horse care students. Sadly, this revealed extensive damage to the spinous processes of the vertebrae in the withers area from a historic traumatic accident that could be giving her ongoing pain. She will therefore no longer be a riding horse, but will have a part to play in New Leaf as a groundwork horse and will take part in our Equine Facilitated Learning sessions and be groomed and pampered and much loved.











## **QUALIFICATION UPDATE**

Over the last term, students have been working hard towards their horse and animal care qualifications, completing written work towards their theoretical assessments and developing their practical skills to enable them to complete their practical observations. Students have then been observed by their assessors, Emily and Clair, to ensure their practical skills have been taught to the correct standard. Lorraine, our IQA (internal quality assurance), also observes some of the assessments to ensure the assessors are consistent and fair in their judgments. This includes topics such as loading and unloading horses for travel, mucking out, feeding horses and completing health checks. Over the remaining term, the students will complete their remaining practical and theoretical assessments to ensure they have completed all the work towards their qualifications by the end of the academic year. Qualifications at New Leaf are run through City and Guilds (horse care only) and Open Awards (animal care and combined horse & animal care).





## NEW EQUINE FACILIATED LEARNING PROGRAMME

Our new EFL programme started a few weeks ago and the young people are enjoying the booklet and horse based activities. So far they've learnt about healthy boundaries, recognising messages within their bodies, emotions and horse communication/behaviour.

## >>> BOOK NOW FOR OUR MAY HALF TERM AND SUMMER SESSIONS!



#### **MAY HALF TERM - \*NEW\* PONY DAY!**

Aimed at all children aged 5 to 15. Spend a day with the horses, learning how to groom, care for, prepare for riding and safely interact with our horses. There will be a chance for horse games and riding too, with a competition and a certificate at the end!

The day will be from 10am until 3pm.

Cost is £60 for one child and £40 for each additional child.

Children will be working in small groups so need to be comfortable with this.

#### **FAMILY FUN DAYS**

These run for set dates over a morning or afternoon. Four or five families attend at the same time and move around a full range of activities at their leisure. Each activity is supervised by an experienced member of staff who can help support all members of the family to take part. Bring a picnic rug and snacks!

Cost: £48 per family.

#### \*NEW\* EQUINE EXPERIENCE DAY - SUMMER ONLY

Our new specialist day for horse lovers! Held at our 2nd site, where we have a working yard with stables and more horses. Come and spend the day improving your riding, groundwork and horse care skills. We can support at beginner, intermediate or advanced level.

Time: 10am-3pm

Dates: 14th & 21st August.



#### **EQUINE FACILITATED LEARNING (EFL)**

As well as dates in September (see website for details), we are also running a short course for EFL over the summer - for 4 weeks of 90 minute sessions. The programme is led by our experienced EFL coach, Bryony (B) and supports resilience, confidence and focus through connection with horses. It includes groundwork, grooming and riding.

Dates: 30th July, 6th August, 13th August & 20th August.

Time: 10am-11:30am.



#### **FAMILY SESSIONS**

Family Sessions can be booked for 1 or 2 hours. You will have a dedicated member of staff to take you round different activities. Parents can join in with the children as much or as little as they like and there is no restriction on the size of the family. There's no minimum age to take part, and babies can be brought along as long as they are supervised at all times. Costs are £24 per hour.



#### **RESPITE SESSIONS**

Respite Sessions can be booked for a minimum of three hours (or sometimes we can do two hours on request) and allow your child to attend without parents being present. Your child will have dedicated one to one support at all times (or two to one support on request) and will engage in a range of activities according to their interests. Costs are £30 per hour.
